

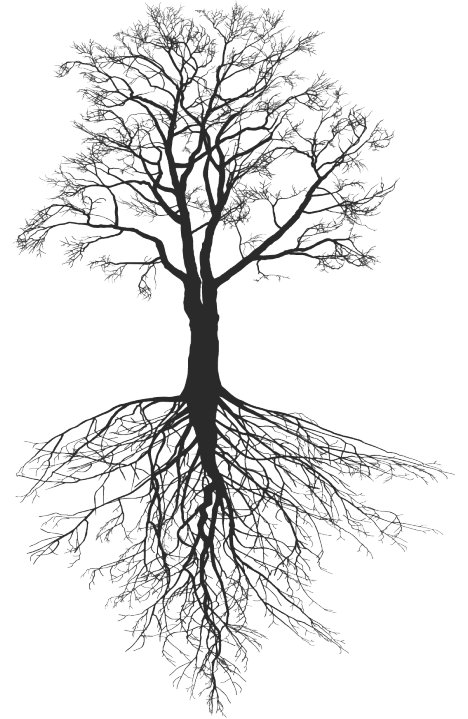
“Rooted in Grace”

Do not miss our sermon series “Rooted in Grace: The life of King David”.

You will have multiple ways to participate in this exciting series:

- 1) Join us in Worship every week to hear and understand the key elements of the “Rooted in Grace” sermon series.
- 2) Participate by utilizing weekly study guides, personal devotions, small group discussions and prayers. To be provided weekly.
